Dear Friends,

Why did Jesus come into the world? That is the question that is at the heart of our celebration of the Advent/Christmas season. This is a season where so many find themselves exhausted by the holiday itself because we lose sight of the reason for the season. While we may look to the gospels of Matthew and Luke for the stories of Jesus' birth and the events leading up to it complete with angels, shepherds, magi, sheep and an imaginary inn keeper (sorry, but there is no inn keeper in the Biblical account), during the season of Advent leading up to Christmas, we will be focusing on a different story for our Sunday Worship theme. "*A Dickens of a Christmas*" will take us through the story of Ebenezer Scrooge and the visitations he had on a fateful Christmas Eve. While Dickens is not a Biblical author and Scrooge is not mentioned in the Bible, this beloved story expounds on the meaning of Christmas and the reason we need Christ. Just as the novella "*A Christmas Carol*" is the tale of a man who is transformed as he faces honestly his past, present, and potential future, we celebrate in this season Jesus who is the transforming figure for our lives and all human history.

I hope that as we move through the month of December, you will choose to worship with your church family either in person, via live-stream, or by a recording found on Facebook. Shepherds and magi came to Bethlehem to worship because this was their way of celebrating this most significant event, each in their own way. Each Sunday, there are two different services of worship. At 8:45 a.m. each Sunday, there is a shorter, quieter service that is focused on the ecumenical lectionary readings for that day, joining with other Christians across denominations and around the world in hearing these same verses. Holy Communion is also celebrated each week at 8:45. At 10:30, worship will be on the theme of "A Dickens of a Christmas" beginning December 1st. December 15th will be our Children's Christmas Pageant at 10:30. Christmas Eve services will be at 4:30 and 9:30 – both will be filled with carols and candle lighting, with the early service featuring a children's story "The Forgotten Lamb" and the later service a sermon entitled "The Christmas Still to Come." The 9:30 service will also include the celebration of Holy Communion. Also, on the first two Wednesdays of advent, December 4th and 11th, there will be a Contemplative Service at 12:15 p.m. in the sanctuary, and on December 18th we will have a labyrinth walk in the Narthex between 4 and 8 p.m. You are invited to come at any time during this four-hour period for a time of reflection as part of your Advent Journey.

I pray that you will be a part of our Advent and Christmas services, and that the true meaning of the season will be in your hearts in this season of hope, peace, joy and love.




